1.0 PURPOSE

The purpose of this procedure is to define the responsibilities for the installation, operating, issuing and replacing of Fleet Tracking & Management System by the Guam Power Authority.

2.0 RESPONSIBILITY

- 2.1 The Fleet Support Service Manager shall be responsible for the following:
 - 1. Ensuring all designated automotive and heavy equipment vehicles are outfitted with the Fleet Tracking & Management System devices.
 - 2. Providing approved personnel with access to the Fleet Management web based system.
 - 3. Providing Fleet Management web based system Training to authorized personnel.
 - 4. Managing of contracts for technical support, upgrades and the purchasing of equipment necessary to maintain the Fleet Tracking & Management System.
 - 5. Managing the issuance of Fleet Tracking & Management System device keys (Dallas Keys) to authorized personnel.
 - 6. Managing the scheduling of vehicles for Fleet Tracking & Management System device maintenance, upgrades, repairs and replacements.
 - 7. Authorizing the disconnecting, removal, storage and salvaging of Fleet Tracking & Management System devices.
 - 2.1.7.1 Devices may only be disconnected, removed or installed by Authorized Transportation personnel and/or contracted technical support personnel.
- 2.2 The Assistant General Manager of Operations (AGMO) is responsible for the following as designated by the General Manager:
 - 1. Designating automotive and heavy equipment vehicles for installation of Fleet Tracking & Management System devices.

- 2. Designated authority for the authorization of Fleet Tracking & Management System device keys issuance.
- 2.3 The Division Managers shall be responsible for the following:
 - 1. Approving of all personnel to be issued/re-issued a Fleet Tracking & Management System device keys (Dallas Keys) within their respective divisions.
 - 2. Approving of all replacement Fleet Tracking & Management System device keys (Dallas Keys) within their respective divisions.
 - 3. Ensuring all automotive and heavy equipment vehicles; within their respective divisions are available; upon scheduling for Fleet Tracking & Management System device maintenance, upgrades, repairs and replacements.
- 2.4 All personnel shall be responsible for the following:
 - 1. The Fleet Tracking & Management System device key (Dallas Key) issued to them.
 - 2. Reporting of damaged, stolen, lost, or malfunctioning keys.
 - 3. The returning of issued key if it is no longer being utilized.

3.0 REGULATIONS

- 3.1 Failure to comply with these regulations may result in; but not limited to, the following:
 - 1. The revocation of all vehicle usage privileges.
 - 2. The suspension of all vehicle usage privileges.
 - 3. Disciplinary action as reflected in the GPA Personnel Rules and Regulations, Code of Conduct and applicable Guam Laws.
- 3.2 Dallas Keys are not to be shared, any keys found, or no longer being utilized by the employee issued the key shall be returned immediately to the Transportation Division.
- 3.3 The Replacement fee per key is \$20.00 and shall be assessed at the discretion of the Assistant General Manager of Operations as designated by the General Manager.
 - 1. Payment to be made at any Guam Power Authority Cashier.
 - 2. Account to be designated by the Guam Power Authority Finance Comptroller.
- 3.4 Any Fleet Tracking & Management System device keys (Dallas Keys) to be issued to vendors or contractors must have prior written approval from the Assistant General Manager of Operations.
- 3.5 The tampering, damaging or removing of Fleet Tracking & Management System devices by unauthorized personnel is strictly prohibited.
